

A Story of the Treaty



This resource, complete with 22 large pictures, a teaching unit, Blackline Masters, and a Commentary to read to the children is a social studies classic. Many schools will find a copy in their resource store room.

It is on display at the Treaty House and the National Library has multiple copies.

The story begins with early settlement, the signing of the Treaty, the carrying of the Treaty around New Zealand, the aftermath with the Northern wars (I sought around the galleries and museums of the world for paintings of scenes from these wars), and Treaty ceremonies today.

In the Commentary referred to, the voices of chiefs can be read to the children to moving effect.

Works best for y. 5 and above.

Yes – from where children start in their knowledge, it has its challenges, but I just ask teachers to select activities from the unit carefully, then trust the unit and keep it simple, the complexity is there, of course, but trusting in the pictures can keep it gratifyingly straightforward.
